


STATE OF UTAH SITUATION REPORT

Significant State Activity

New **Final Flooding Situation Report -** This will be the final flooding-specific situation report. Future situation reports will be created as needed.

Active Sandbag Disposal - As statewide flooding activities move from response to recovery, a recovery priority is information sharing on what the public can do with their used and unused sandbags. Residents and businesses are encouraged to visit their local emergency management websites and social media outlets to learn proper disposal tactics, as well as locations to drop off sandbags.

Immediate Concerns

• No significant concerns to report at this time.

Current State (SERT) Actions

- Active Activated Emergency Support Functions: ESF #5, ESF #14, ESF #15, Logistics, VDCT, and Finance. All ESFs are scheduled to demobilize on 6.30.23.
- Recovery phase activities such as completing and reviewing preliminary damage assessments will continue as the response phase comes to an end.


WEATHER
